SECTION A

Item 1

Item 2

Missionaries were the people who came to East Africa with the main aim of spreading the gospel. They penetrated East Africa around 1844. The pioneer missionaries in East Africa were the church Missionary Society led by Germans John Krapt and Johann Rebmann who arrived in Eat Africa around 1846 respectively, Krapt arrived and established a Muslim station at Rabai Mpya <u>Task</u>

- B. Give reasons for establishment of many churches today.(05 scores)
