NATIONALITIES

It is very interesting to meet people of different nationalities. This can be either at a party or at school. Nationality refers to the legal belonging to a particular nation or country. Sometimes a person may have dual nationality. Dual nationality means citizens of two countries.

In our school, we always meet pupils of different nationalities for example; we meet Sudanese, Indians, Congolese, Kenyans, Rwandans, and Tanzanians. Dual nationality means a citizen of two countries.

Students from Congo speak Lingala, while those from Rwanda speak Kinyarwanda and French. They speak French because they were colonized by France. Kenyan and Tanzanian students usually speak Kiswahili while Ugandan nations speak a variety of local languages such as Luganda, Runyakitara, Luo, Lumasaba and others.
